

### St Andrews Primary School year 6 swimming data 2019-2020

Swimming is a national curriculum requirement and by the end of key stage 2 pupils are expected to be able to swim confidently and know how to be safe in and around water. The 3 national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety. See the below table.

The following year 6 attainment data is provided from the most recent swimming lessons within the County Durham School Swimming SLA provision. This is because the year 6 children did not have an opportunity to complete their swimming lessons this year due to the COVID pandemic, school and swimming pool closures. It is not the data that we were hoping for as the children were swimming well. The most recent data on Swimphony is as follows;

Last years swimming data had improved on the previous year and on the year before.

Swim 25m unaided	86.7%

Perform a safe self-rescue	100%

St Andrews Primary school year 6 swimming data 2016-2017	
Passed	38.6%

As you will see comparing the above data, the swimming is improving each year. This is something we are proud of at St Andrews. Swimming is valued as part of our PE curriculum program.

Moving forward to next year, we will ensure that year 5 and year 6 have swimming priority when the pools reopen. We will also be looking into extra sessions of swimming using the sport premium funding.
