## Parent Response to Remote Learning During Lockdown Jan-March 2021

Thank you to all the parents that completed the questionnaire to better understand the effectiveness of remote learning delivered by school, communication by school and during COVID between January 2021 and March 2021.

School received 37 responses, majority of which were extremely positive. This confirms to staff and governors that all that could have been done to ensure that remote learning during lockdown was successful had been done – thank you.

We know that remote learning looked different for some children depending on family circumstances, internet strength and that children were using a variety of devices. School offered laptops and/or tablets to those families who did not have access to a device. We know that it was challenging to suit everyone's needs during lockdown. We appreciate feedback and on the rare occasion we receive negative feedback, the Senior Leadership Team discuss the comment and decide whether further action needs to be taken. However, it would be wrong to make changes for a minority of parents when the majority are perfectly happy with what is currently in place.

## School Response - Summary


The vast majority of the children at our school accessed remote learning (92%), we know this through internal data from registers. The response from the parent survey tells us that parents feel that school made every effort to provide quality remote learning and communicated well with parents and school agrees. During remote learning, parents said that most children continued to learn and make progress and school agrees that the children did make progress during January to March.

The majority of parents said that their child accessed daily zoom lessons, if not every day, then at least half of the week. School agrees that most children accessed zoom lessons at some point and data shows that the majority of children who were on daily zoom lessons made more progress than those who did not. Form the survey 34 out of 37 parents felt that the amount of work set by school was of the right amount and school agrees with this.

The vast majority of parents also felt that the school cared for their child's well-being as well as nurturing their education and school agrees that their best effort was made to ensure the child's well-being was at the forefront.
















9. Did you experience any of the following issues when trying to access daily zoom lessons?






13. Which of the following did your child use on a regular basis


